NOTES FOR GUIDANCE 2023/24

The Jack Petchey Glee Club Challenge is a singing, performance and dancing education project and competition. At all stages of the competition, entrants will be judged by a panel of judges selected by The Jack Petchey Foundation. The Jack Petchey Foundation is completely neutral in this and our overriding concern is to provide the young people with the best performance and educational experience possible.

At all stages of the competition the judges' decision will be final and no correspondence, appeals or negotiation will be entered into.

The Jack Petchey Glee Club Challenge is open to all schools, organisations and groups based within any London Borough and the county of Essex.

Groups may choose to enter **ANY ONE** of the regional finals and **ANY ONE** of the Regional Bootcamps. Attendance at both is compulsory. When completing your entry form you will be asked to name your first and second choice Regional Final/Bootcamp – we will do our best to meet your first choice requirements but cannot guarantee this.

Once groups have selected a Regional Final/Bootcamp, and this has been confirmed, that cannot be changed.

Your group must consist of no fewer than 10 and no more than 30 members.

Every member of your group must be between the ages of 11 and 25 on 1st of September 2023. Proof of age may be required.

Your group's regular meeting and rehearsal space must be located in London or Essex.

STAGE 1

The organisers will acknowledge receipt of all applications within 72 hours of receipt so please contact us if you have not heard within that time.

STAGE 2

Following STAGE 1 the judges will select the regional finalists from the videos posted and assessment visits made.

There will be up to 12 Regional Finalists selected for each of the Regional Finals.

All groups selected for the Regional Finals will be expected to attend a Glee Club 'Boot Camp'. At the Regional Finals groups will perform two **contrasting** numbers – one of the numbers should be contemporary pop the other can be from any genre - those numbers should be in a reasonable performance state to be presented to the artistic team at Bootcamp. On this day you will get to meet and work with a professional choreographer, performance and singing coach. You will also get to perform your chosen numbers for the final and receive tips and coaching to improve your performances.

Boot Camp dates and venues can be found on the Challenge website.

Attendance at the 'Boot Camps' is compulsory and groups must ensure they are available to attend prior to application.

There will be five Regional Finals in London and Essex. Groups must ensure that they are available to attend their Regional Final prior to application.

Regional Final dates and venues can be found on the Challenge website. Groups will be expected to perform 2 contrasting numbers at the regional finals.

STAGE 3

The top scoring groups from each of the Regional Finals will go through to the Grand Final.

In the event of a tie at a Regional Final for the top qualifying places the group that has received the highest marks from the Chief Judge will be selected.

Once the Grand Finalists have been announced a second 'Boot Camp' will be held for Grand Finalists. Once again, the 'Boot Camp' is compulsory.

The Grand Final venue and date are detailed on the Challenge website.

Groups will be expected to perform 2 numbers at the Grand Final. They can repeat their original final numbers or they can perform different numbers. Groups can choose their own numbers to perform, although the final decision rests with the organisers.

At the Grand Final the winners of The Jack Petchey Glee Club Challenge will be announced.

Any cash prize offered will be in the form of a purchase of either services or equipment for the winning groups by The Jack Petchey Foundation.

TECHNICAL CONSIDERATIONS

At the Regional Finals each group will have access to a maximum of EIGHT head set wireless microphones per performance. There will also be various "pick up" microphones on stage for ambient sound. Groups should ensure that their song choices, and the division of solo lines, take this into account.

During the technical rehearsals in the theatres for both the Regional Finals and Grand Finals the Jack Petchey Glee Club Challenge artistic team have full responsibility and final say on any artistic and/or technical decisions regarding any and all performances.

CHAPERONES

Regardless of the age of the entrants, each group must have at least two adult chaperones that are responsible for the conduct and organisation of the group. Failure to provide chaperones at either the boot camp or finals will result in the group being disqualified. The maximum number of chaperones per group allowed backstage at any venue or at any Boot Camp shall be three.

JUDGING CRITERIA

Each Regional Final and the Grand Final shall be judged by a panel of Judges invited by The Jack Petchey Foundation. The artistic team that groups meet at the Boot Camp days will not be part of the judging panel and will have no say whatsoever in the final result of either the Regional Final or Grand Final. The decision of the judges is final.

The panel of Judges will score each group against the following criteria:

Vocal (30%)

Sound quality, Projection and pitch, Balance and blend, Diction, Rhythmic precision, Dynamics and Harmonies

Visual (30%)

Overall stage presence and performance, Relationship between movement and lyric, Dance technique and execution, Use of costume and props.

NOTE – all choreography should be original.

Team (20%)

Working together, Well-rehearsed and drilled, Imaginative group staging, Engaging all members of the group

Entertainment Value (20%)

Overall Entertainment value of the piece regardless of any of the above.
